

Growlers Choir Composer and Manager



Pierre-Luc Senécal is a music composer and sound studio owner based in Montreal, Canada. He specializes in creating original, unique soundtracks and sonic adventures.

He is renowned for its broad palette of high quality services: film scores, contemporary dance music and concert pieces, music production and innovative show experiences.

Listen to his music and you will discover dark depths and halos of luminous sounds. Hear the roar of its repertoire, both complex and contrasted.

Master of Music (Université de Montréal, CA), Pierre-Luc Senécal built his artistic practice within the

rich electroacoustic music field. Strongly inspired by rock, pop, and metal, he instills his electronic pieces with his sensibility, lyricism and dashing passion.

His work has been presented in Canada, Germany, Italy, Monaco, Russia, Sweden, South Korea and in the US. Amongst his notable achievements, and the founding of the dark, clamorous and attention-catching Growlers Choir, the most famous vocal ensemble in the world exclusively made up of metal singers. Their appearance on the TV reality show America's Got Talent garnered them worldwide attention. Pierre-Luc Senécal is a grant recipient from the Conseil des arts de Montréal, the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec, the Canada Council for the Arts, and the Fond de Recherche du Québec - Society and Culture.

Growlers Choir Conductor



Born and raised in deprived neighborhoods of Montreal, **Pascal Germain-Berardi** is a conductor who found life through music and became the first of his family to reach college. He recently completed his doctoral studies in orchestral conducting at University of Montreal under professors Jean-François Rivest (I Musici) and Paolo Bellomia (former assistant of Pierre Boulez).

Also holding a master's degree in composition, Pascal has a thing for dramatic and powerful music. His influences ranges from bombastic classical composers like Beethoven, Bruckner and Liszt all the way up to extreme metal bands like Strapping Young Lad, Necrophagist and Vektor. His compositional style blends the narrative principles of classical music with a contemporary approach to harmonies and melodic language.

Pascal is conductor for the ensemble Forestare, a 12 classical guitars band with whom he just recorded his first ATMA album as music director with works by Ravel and Debussy arranged for guitars. He's also founder and artistic director of « Temps Fort », a production company with which he conducts a wide range of vocal and instrumental ensembles made of young professionals. He held multiple assistant-conductor positions and has been very active as a professional chorister (Montreal Opera, Montreal Symphony, Notre-Dame Basilica of Montreal) and with the Growlers Choir, the world's only active choir made of metal growlers.

Pascal had the privilege to study conducting with Bramwell Tovey (Vancouver Symphony), Yannick Nézet-Séguin (Orchestre métropolitain), Jon Washburn (Vancouver Chamber Choir), Joseph Flummerfelt (New York Philharmonic), Ovidiu Balan (Mihail Philarmonia Bacau) and Andrew Megill (Montreal Symphony Choirs, Illinois University).

Growlers Choir Narrator and Poet



Artist and poet, Fortner Anderson is noted for the performance of his poems, his unique artist books and installations, and his formalist and experimental work to renew and expand poetic forms. His publications of poetry include reiterations (2022), an e-book whose content of 24 sonnets change with each reading, Considerations (2021) a formalist text in the form of a silver-age comic book, Points of Departure (2017) a book of poems encased in bronze,

and annunciations (2012), a poetic re-interpretation of the final minutes of the space shuttle Columbia disaster.

He has presented his poetry in the United States, Canada, Colombia and across Europe. His performances and installations have been showcased widely including at the Festival Internationale de Musique Actuelle à Victoriaville and the Festival Internazionale di Poesia di Genova. In 2007, he was awarded the La voix électrique prize for career achievement in performance poetry and in 2018, he received the Poésie dans la cité award from the Conseil des arts de Montréal for his project with Geneviève Letarte, "L'inventaire des faits en neuf lieux de Montréal un après-midi d'été." His work, "The DayKing"has become one of the Growler Chorus' signature works. Originally from the American Midwest, Fortner Anderson now lives and works in Montreal, Canada.

Our Conductor

Michael Zaugg: Managing & Artistic Director and Principal Conductor

Swiss-native Michael Zaugg has distinguished himself as an innovative and versatile conductor, pedagogue and clinician. Currently in his 11th season as Artistic Director and Principal Conductor of the professional chamber choir Pro Coro Canada in Edmonton, Michael also previously led other notable Canadian choirs including, in Montreal, the St. Lawrence Choir (2008-2013) and voces boreales (2006-2015), and the Cantata Singers Ottawa (2005-2014).

As Chorus Master of the Orchestre Symphonique de Montréal (2006-2011), Michael successfully prepared groups of up to 1500 singers for OSM Artistic Director Kent Nagano, including the award-winning production Saint François d'Assise by Messiaen. Michael also prepared the Cantata Singers Ottawa for their appearances with the National Arts Centre Orchestra under conductors such as Franz-Paul Decker, Trevor Pinnock, and Helmuth Rilling.

Active as a Guest Conductor, Michael Zaugg has worked with notable groups including the Vancouver Chamber Choir, National Youth Choir of Canada, the BBC Singers, Vancouver's musica intima, Thirteen Strings, as well as the Longueuil Symphony Orchestra. Michael's US debut was with the Grammy-nominated Choir of Trinity Wall Street in New York. He has led a 60-voice male choir, with singers selected from across Canada, the US and the Ukraine, to perform the Resurrection Liturgy by Fr. John Sembrat (Alberta) in tours across the



Prairies and to Toronto, Philadelphia, Rochester and New York City.

Originally an accomplished tenor, Michael became the first Swiss conductor to be accepted to the Royal Academy of Music in Stockholm, Sweden in its prestigious post-graduate program for Professional Choir Conducting. Mr. Zaugg also holds degrees in voice and music education from the University in Basel. In 2018 he was awarded an Honorary Degree of Doctor of Music (Hon DMus) by Scotland's King's College, University of Aberdeen.

In 2020 Michael Zaugg, together with Pro Coro Canada, received the Choral Canada national Award for Outstanding Innovation for the CHORAL ART at the Banff Centre for Arts and Creativity. He was also a 2020 recipient of the Edmonton Artists Trust Fund Award, and the recipient of the Con Spirito Award from Choir Alberta in 2022.

Pro Coro Canada



Founded in 1981 by Canadian Michel Marc Gervais, Pro Coro Canada has performed at the Toronto International Choral Festival (1994 and 2002), the 1988 Olympic Arts Festival, and Canadian Voices (2003 landmark series of concerts celebrating 50 years of professional choral singing in Canada and R. Murray Schafer's 70th year). The choir has commissioned dozens of new works, the majority by Canadian composers. Pro Coro Canada produced the second Edmonton International Choral Festival from May 30th to June 2nd, 2019.

The twenty-four voices of Pro Coro Canada have been shaped by some of the finest choral conductors in the world, including Gervais, Anders Eby (Sweden), Søren Hansen (Denmark), Agnes Grossmann (Austria), and Richard Sparks (USA). Guest conductors have included Frieder Bernius, Eric Ericson, Gary Graden, Maria Guinand, Bo Holten, Elmer Iseler, Tönu Kaljuste, Diane Loomer, Leonard Ratzlaff, Ward Swingle, Ivars Taurins, Jon Washburn, and Erik Westberg. In early 2012 Michael Zaugg was announced as Pro Coro's new Artistic Director and Principal Conductor.

Under the direction of Swiss-born Michael Zaugg, the choir is widely recognized as one of this country's finest. The choir is particularly proud of its composer-in-residence program with internationally renowned composer Alberto Grau; its appointment as Faculty in the Choral Art program at the Banff Centre; and critically acclaimed tours of four provinces. Pro Coro Canada believes strongly in community partnerships and over the past few years has collaborated with many community choirs as well as mentoring young choral artists through their Emerging Artist Program.



Growlers Choir



The most famous growlers choir in history. Composed solely of metal vocalists called "growlers", Growlers Choir blends metal and experimental music in a way that is unique and groundbreaking. Hailing from Montreal, one of the world's capitals of metal music, the 13 metal vocalist ensemble was dreamt up by composer Pierre-Luc Senécal in 2016. What may have been a wild fantasy for many metalheads was finally brought to fruition in May 2019, when the band took the stage for their first public performance. Their first piece, the mythical "The Dayking", has triggered a frenzy of ecstatic comments, calling it "masterfully arranged", "mindblowing", "a ritual of summoning demons from the other dimensions", a descent "into literal unbridled chaos". This success was in no small part due to the lead speaker's of the piece, Fortner Anderson. Pioneer of the spoken word scene in Montreal, his reading of his text "The Dayking" has been described as dramatically poignant, visceral and riveting.

Since, Growlers Choir has dedicated itself to producing ambitious concerts, creating bewitching music and exploring vocal techniques. Fascinated by extreme metal as well as a variety of throat singing techniques, Growlers Choir showcases the sonic potential of the voice and demonstrates its extraordinary properties, both sensual and monstrous.

In May 2021, Growlers Choir headlined the Festival international de musique actuelle de Victoriaville, one of the most respected events of its kind in North America. In June 2021, it collaborated with classical choir Temps Fort for the concert "Extreme Vocals". The event comprised 60 minutes of music for double choir (14 growlers and 24 singers) in a 50,000 square foot church.

Growlers Choir's original musical hydra has attracted a variety of public and media such as Vice News, popular Quebecer talk show Tout le monde en parle and MetalSucks, one of the most important media of the metal music scene.

Growlers Choir is a grant recipient from the Canadian Council of the Arts, the Conseil des arts et des lettres du Québec and the Conseil des arts de Montréal.

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








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Texts & Translations

Press me soft, a saxophone's glittering button, make me thus yellow, thus ochre and golden, breathe into me until I spill sound, relax the fists my stomach has eaten, smooth my red knuckles to blue studs of water and let all who touch me drench me, jolt me into a twilight where amicas bent in gusts of wind might envy the curve of my spine, the sheen of my back, dappled in sweat and rain.
